This responds to your email request dated December 18, 2007 asking for the identity and input of several NPS employees referred to in our FOIA response dated September 14, 2007.

Regarding your request above, no such documents exist. We have searched our files and previously forwarded to you 163 pages of documents that were responsive to your earlier request. The FOIA does not require that new records be created in response to a request and only applies to records in existence at the time of the request.

Under FOIA, you have the right to appeal this determination within 30 days of the date of this letter (Saturday, Sunday, and public holidays excepted):

An appeal shall be initiated by filing a written notice of appeal. The notice shall be accompanied by copies of the original request and the initial denial and should contain a detailed statement of the reasons the requestor believes the initial denial to have been in error. 43 CFR § 2.30(c)

Address the appeal, clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal," to the attention of the Freedom of Information Act Appeals Officer, U.S. Department of the Interior, 1849 C Street, NW, Mail Stop 7456-MIB, Washington, DC 20240. Please provide them with any other information you may have that leads you to believe that the requested records not located do, in fact, exist including where they might be found if the location is known to you.
