This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated February 8, 2007, and received at the National Park Service's (NPS) FOIA office on March 28, 2007, seeking documents relating to the NPS response to the Virginia Citizens Defense League's petition for rulemaking to change 36 CFR 2.4 (Request No. NPS-2007-00335)

The FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, generally provides that the Government shall make documents available to the public for inspection and copying to the widest extent possible. Certain classes of documents, however, may be exempt if sound legal grounds exist for invoking an exemption. The FOIA does not require that new records be created in response to a request and only applies to records in existence at the time of the request.

We have searched our files and found 163 pages of documents that are responsive to your request, and are releasing them in their entirety.

We have classified your request as an "All Others" request, meaning that you are required to pay for search time and duplication fees, however, you will receive the first 2 hours of search time and the first 100 pages of duplication free of charge. By letter dated April 30, 2007, you agreed to pay fees, however, not to exceed charges of \$155.20.

The fees incurred, after your entitlements, amounts to:


